GENERAL

- All 40 patients enrolled in Dry eye study have completed the final visit. A site monitoring visit was carried out during the month by the CRO. Now, sometime in December, close out visit will take place.
- A get to gather of ROP babies and their parents was organised on 1st October at Mandvi. 28 parents came with their babies. BUT, we felt little sad because almost none of the baby is under regular yearly follow up. Dr. Kavin Shroff our retina specialist, explained the need for regular follow up in details. All the kids underwent dilated retinoscopy and fundus examination. We are planning for a similar meeting in Dharampur.
- A get to gather of Camp organisers and well-wishers of our eye camps was organised on 29th October. 50 well-wishers participated in the meeting and we shared with them our ideas and requested for their support in strengthening vision centres. Their response was very encouraging. They also gave us a few suggestions. We will work upon their suggestions.
- An ethics committee meeting was planned on 1st October. Two studies one IOL study of Biotech and one Myopia spectacles film study were given approval.
- World Sight Day was celebrated at Vyara and Khapar. We examined Janak Smarak Hospital staff in Vyara and Panchayat office staff in Khapar. A quiz competition and poster competition were organised at Mandvi for our optometry students.
- Mr. Debashis Maiti from Mission for Vision came to Mandvi for audit of activities at Vyara and Khapar. He will send his report soon. He has made some observations and gave some suggestions also. We will look into the same and try to improve upon our practices based on suggestions.
- We have joined the LEAP series for improving cataract surgical outcomes run by Aravind eye hospital. Two basic information sharing sessions have taken place. The team from Aravind has come to Mandvi to assess our practices and understand the areas for improvement on 30th. They will be here till 2nd November. Our team will be going to Madurai in second week of December.
- Internal and external plaster of B building is completed in October. Electrical work is also going on in three buildings. Internal masonry work and plaster work is going on. We have procured plumbing material. Granite application at seal level has started in all buildings.
